

Intervention on provisional agenda item 15.1 Social Determinants of Health 77th WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

Honourable Chair, Distinguished Delegates,

Thank you for the opportunity to speak on behalf of the International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP) the global organisation representing over four million pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists worldwide.

Health inequities arise from avoidable and often unfair differences in treatment and outcomes, often linked to social determinants of health, and including education, economic status, housing, age, gender, and many other factors. Here, FIP highlights the critical role that pharmacists play in addressing health inequities. As highlighted by FIP campaign Think Health Think Pharmacy, pharmacists are very accessible and pivotal to ensuring equitable access to affordable, high-quality healthcare services, health education, medicines, medical devices, and vaccines.¹

We encourage Member States to leverage pharmacists' expertise and accessibility in improving health equity and to prioritise their inclusion in healthcare policies aimed at addressing inequitable health outcomes arising from the social determinants of health.
